In the documentary series, we witness Depue working with students who face various obstacles, often out of their control, and attempting to manage emotions making day-to-day school activities challenging. Each day, Depue is normalizing mental health and teaches strategies to his kids to help them cope with the myriad of issues and barriers that are present in their lives.

He notes that working with a diverse population of students coming from different backgrounds and speaking different languages creating a melting pot within the school environment is one of the many aspects of his job that he finds rewarding.

A social worker for Millard North Middle School, Depue spends his days working with students and staff to provide additional support for students' social and emotional health.

In his free time, Eric can be found with his family and friends. His wife of 13 years, Jill, and he have three children, Brynlee, Macy, and Marley and a sweet new addition to the family, a puppy.

facial hair. This is because Eric is an active member in Mustaches for Kids Omaha, a philanthropic group that chooses a charity each year to donate funds to help kids in the Omaha metro area.

Last year alone, Eric personally raised \$13,000 and the group as a whole raised a grand total of \$750,000 to donate to an Omaha based charity.

Depue still calls his CHS classmates some of his best friends to this day and enjoys coming back to Columbus for the CHS Alumni Basketball Tournament. Just as he did in high school, Depue continues to play basketball at a competitive level. If I can help a kid, if I can have a kid know that there's one person who cares and will listen and will be there for him or her, that fills my bucket. That's what I do this for."


