District items, bond issue progressing

What is not happening at Columbus Public Schools? From my seat, that list is very short. Our school district continues to distinguish itself from other school districts with the success of our students and staff.

It is our job to continue gaining momentum for the best education we can provide our student body.

This spring we will be starting a new chapter for Columbus Public Schools. Our school district is going through a comprehensive strategic planning process to identify the needs of our school district over the next 3-5 years.

A road map of sense to provide a direction for our board of education, administration, and staff. Our strategic plan is long overdue and we need to look into the future and shape our school district to meet the needs of our community.

The board of education is currently searching for a replacement for myself as superintendent of Columbus Public Schools.

These past fourteen years have been awesome leading a great school district. I can't wait to see what the strategic plan sets in place and the goals for this school district into the future. The board of education will announce the next superintendent on March 25, 2024. I will work with that individual on a transition plan so it will be a smooth process for everyone.

This spring our board of education has decided to pursue a \$26 million dollar bond issue. The bond vote will be during the primary election on May 14, 2024. The bond issue will entail safety and security at all of our school buildings. This will include bullet protection film for all glass doors, secured vestibule entrances at four of our elementary schools. and new security cameras across the school district.

The second part of this bond issue will be to improve and update the kitchens and dining areas of four of our elementary schools.

RON LAMBERT

Class of 1957 - Entrepreneur and Real Estate Developer

Following graduation from Kramer High School, Ron attended Commercial Extension Business School of Commerce and majored in marketing and accounting. After that he worked in sales, returning to Columbus in 1967.

He founded Mid-American Research Chemical (MARC) in 1970. He would go on to sell the company 18 years later and it is still active in business in 2024. Ron was also a founder of Paraclipse, another local company still in the community in 2024.

In addition to these business pursuits, he and his family developed Country Shadows Golf Course and Housing addition and was a co-developer of Country Club Shores Lake and Housing development.

Ron has served on several community boards, one that he is particularly proud of is the Columbus Community

Hospital Board and the building of the new Columbus Community Hospital as well as the establishment of the Columbus Community Hospital Foundation.



• ADRIANNE ELLEFSON ROGERS, M.D.

Class of 1950 - Physician, Researcher and Educator

Following graduation from Kramer High School, Dr. Rogers received her AB from Radcliffe College followed by her MD from Harvard University in 1958.

She proceeded to conduct her Intern in Medicine at Beth Israel Hospital in Boston, MA before becoming a Research Fellow in the pathology department at the Mallory Institute which is part of Harvard University Medical School.

Dr. Rogers held the certification of Diplomate of both the American Board of Pathology and the American Board of Toxicology.

During her career she served as a research associate and senior research scientist at MIT, was an associate pathologist at Boston City Hospital, an associate chair of pathology as well as the director of the office of medical education at Boston University.

She later served as the interim associate dean of Academic Affairs as well as a professor of pathology at Boston University. Dr. Ellefson Rogers held numerous memberships and was a contributing author on various articles and professional journals.

EICKHOFF-SHEMEK, Ph.D
Class of 1970 Professor and Author

Following graduation from Columbus High School, she attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln where she received her BS and MS in Physical Education.

Prior to receiving her Ph.D. from UNL she worked as a fitness manager and exercise professional in community and clinical settings for nearly 20 years.

She later served as the Coordinator of the Fitness and Wellness Management graduate program at University of Nebraska at Omaha and was the Founding Coordinator of the Exercise Science undergraduate program at the University of South Florida, in Tampa.

Dr. Eickhoff-Shemek is the Founder & President of the Fitness Law Academy, LLC and Professor Emeritus, Exercise Science at the University of South Florida.

She is an internationally known researcher, author and speaker in the areas of legal liability, risk management, and fitness safety.



 DR. S. KAY (BECHER) ROCKWELL, Ph.D

Class of 1957 - Professor & Evaluation Specialist in the Dept of Ag Leadership, Education and Communication at UNL, Humanitarian

Following graduation from Kramer High School, she earned her BS in Nursing from UNMC College of Nursing and taught nursing students. She continued her education earning her MA and Ph.D. at UNL.

Then switching professions, Dr. Rockwell became internationally known for Targeting Outcomes of Programs, co-authored with a colleague from USDA. She is currently Professor Emeritus at UNL. Dr. Rockwell volunteered for the Farmer-2-Farmer Program in USAID and taught subsistence farmers in Kenya, East Africa, to work cooperatively with their neighbors to obtain top dollar for their commodities.

Through the Protestant Inland Church, she arranged a partnership with one congregation to build a preschool and a public library, and to establish the Goats for Voo initiative where 1 Billy goat and 3 ewes were given to about 1,000 HIV+ orphan families. The initiative increased the family's income sufficiently to purchase clothing and shoes, and other supplies required for all children in the family to attend public school.

In 2023, a demonstration classroom was funded for the community to respond to the President's mandate to Harvest the Skies so Kenya, a water deficit country, will have sufficient water to meet future needs.

are outdated and not large enough to keep up with our growing student population or the ability to serve over 13,000 meals during the summer lunch program. This program includes all children within our community.

The third part of this bond proposal is to add 12-14 classrooms to our existing middle school and expand our dining area to serve 1,200 students.

Our current middle school enrollment is 1,240 and the building has a capacity of 1,200.

So we are a little cramped in this space. This will allow the school flexibility in space to accommodate not only the growth of our student body but allow us to serve all 1,200 students comfortably in our cafeteria.

Our current cafeteria is set up to serve 800 high school students comfortably. Our high school had an open campus and never had to serve the entire student body.

Please keep informed of what is going on in our school district. Many things are happening and we continue to progress to meet the needs of our community.

DISTRICT BOND REFERENDUM

On March 1st, the Columbus Public Schools Board of Education approved a facilities bond referendum in the amount of \$26 million based on results of voter surveys, a community town hall meeting and the effects that LB 878 could have on our growing school district. The vote will take place on May 14th.

WHAT'S PROPOSED?

- Safety and Security Improvements in the District's existing buildings and facilities
 - Bullet resistant window coverings
 - Security camera updates
 - Secure and controlled entrances
- Addition and improvements to the existing middle school building to include a classroom addition and remodeling of dining facilities.
- Additions and improvements to existing elementary buildings to include dining areas and kitchens at Centennial, Emerson, North Park and West Park.
- Providing for the necessary furniture, equipment and apparatus for such additions, renovations and improvements.



THE PROPOSED PROJECTS WILL:


- Will meet the immediate facility needs of Columbus Public Schools.
- Will address safety and security needs across all district buildings.
- Will expand eating and kitchen preparation areas at four elementary schools where they are not large enough to accommodate the student population.
- Will expand CMS dining areas to accommodate 1,200+ students.
 The current space is designed for 800 high school students.
- Will relieve overcrowded classrooms at Columbus Middle School.

CPS' projected enrollment for 2030 is 4,600 students, an increase of 340 students from the current year.


