

## F and C Cup Adds New Chapter as Game Goes to Memorial Stadium



A welcome message from Columbus Public Schools' new Superintendent

hen I arrived at Columbus Public Schools in 2020 as the Director of Finance and Human Resources the thought of someday becoming the Superintendent was not even a consideration. I was very fortunate to be hired in a role that allowed me to impact very specific areas of the District.

During that time, CPS faced some very unique challenges with the changes in legislation that determined our funding. CPS also saw dramatic changes, along with the entire country, in the recruiting and retention of teachers, the scarcity of support staff, and the contentious climate toward public education.

Throughout it all, I have worked with a team of leaders to ensure we didn't reduce staff, could provide higher than the cost-of-living raises/wages, and invest in strategies to support our staff and students.

As a very young teacher, I had a tremendous mentor by the name of Ed Moore. Coach Moore knew I had aspirations and we had a conversation in the spring of 1993 that likely changed my course forever.

"If you aspire for a position, a position is what you will have", however, "If you aspire to lead, then impact is what you will have". He looked me squarely in the eyes SUPERINTENDENT DR. CHIP KAY

and told me I had it in me to be a great leader. Thirty-two years later I have been fortunate to hold different positions in education and each time it was the opportunity to lead and impact others that were the driving forces behind being in that seat.

As I embark in my new role as Superintendent I promise to never stop leading, serving, and impacting people in our school and community positively.

A lot of work was completed this July to put the building blocks in place that allows us to move forward with a vision to support the upcoming strategic plan and be responsive to the needs assessed at the end of last school year.

We are planning a public release of the plan and the action goals in late August. I don't want to spoil the theme, but it starts and ends with our students!

There may be a lot of questions about what's next (school bond, programs, funding, staffing, etc.), but those will all be answered in the coming months. The future at CPS is going to continue to center around our students.

Roger Garcia's journey from Columbus High School (CHS) in 2005 to becoming a prominent figure as the county commissioner for Douglas County, Nebraska, is a testament to following one's passions and embracing opportunities for community service and leadership.

## EARLY INFLUENCES AND FOND MEMORIES

Reflecting on his time at CHS, Roger credits several influential figures who shaped his path. "Mr. Terry as my psychology teacher was a huge influence," he recalls. "I quickly fell in love with psychology, which later grew into a passion for helping people."

He also acknowledges choir teacher Mr. Ritter's impact and his English teachers, especially Mrs. Kwapnioski, for their guidance. Ms. Carol Hess, his guidance counselor, played a pivotal role during his senior year, providing invaluable support as he navigated college decisions and scholarships.Roger, who is now both a community leader and an assistant pastor,



fondly remembers his CHS days, including choir concerts, lunchtime conversations with friends, and the formative experiences in classes that nurtured his interests in psychology and literature.

"I had a goth phase throughout high school," he says with a chuckle, reflecting on his unconventional style at the time — a stark contrast to his present role in the church.


#### PERSONAL GROWTH AND MARTIAL ARTS
